



## Charlwood Design wins 2009 Good Design Award



Charlwood Design is thrilled to announce that we have been honoured with a 2009 GOOD DESIGN AWARD from The Chicago Athenaeum: Museum of Architecture and Design. Our design for the simbox patient monitor was awarded in the medical device category. Museum President Christian K. Narkiewicz-Laine described the GOOD DESIGN AWARD as 'the most coveted design prize for the most innovative and advanced design produced worldwide.'

Founded in Chicago in 1950 by architects Eero Saarinen, Charles and Ray Eames, and Edgar Kaufmann, Jr., In 2010, GOOD DESIGN celebrates its 60-year anniversary as the oldest and most prestigious awards program for product and graphic design. Charlwood Design was awarded alongside international design teams from 35 nations including Apple, Hewlett-Packard, Porsche Design, Mercedes-Benz and Qantas.

The Simbox Patient Monitor device is a class 1 medical product designed to improve the quality of life for people suffering incontinence and help reduce the cost of clinical care in the community. A monitor is worn by the patient and it uses a wireless mesh network to communicate through nodes to the base station. The units are recharged through a docking system. Charlwood developed the complete system and managed the injection moulding production.
